WORKING WITH TRAUMA

We understand that many of our students have experienced or are currently experiencing various degrees of trauma. Whether this be in their personal lives, or from not having their needs met throughout their time in education. We recognise the wide-spread impact of trauma which helps us to look beyond the individuals behaviours.

SupaJam's role is not to treat any trauma related challenges but to help by removing barriers to enable students to access the right support.



OUR COMMITMENT TO INDIVIDUAL NEEDS

At SupaJam we support students with a range of needs. This includes students who are neurodiverse, have sensory or physical needs and/or broader learning difficulties.

Our ethos is inclusive and we try to meet the needs of learners for whom a large mainstream provider may not be appropriate.

As a college with a focus on the music business, there is a lot of room for students to express themselves which is a fundametal aspect of our unique offer. Our cohort is made up of individuals and their learning needs are factored in as part of this diverse melting pot.

Our staff are trained to meet the needs of students both within and outside of the class. We also liaise with different therapists so as to facilitate key services such as speech and language therapy.

Outside our main music curriculum, students will study a variety of subjects in preparation for their life beyond college. From finance skills to independent life skills and sex education. They also have the benefit of fun organised activities helping them gain social and communication skills.



OUTCOMES

SupaJam looks at every aspect of a student's life, with a significant focus on student outcomes. We also concentrate on improving our courses for our students, ensuring that student voices are heard and that they know that their opinions matter.

In July 2024, over 90% of SupaJam students achieved a RSL vocational Qualification. In 2025 alone all of our Level 3 students in Brighton have been offered their first choice place at University.

We are equally proud of the progress students made in Maths and English from their starting points with a higher % of students achieving a grade 4+ in their English GCSE resits than students nationally.

Our programmes provide students with amazing opportunities for industry work experience and interactions with professionals from all areas of the music business. Beyond SupaJam, we support our students with a variety of opportunities from apprenticeships and paid employment to Higher and Further Education. Many students are continuing their studies at colleges and universities across the country



Some of our additional curriculum is delivered through ASDAN Short Courses. These are flexible, portfoliobased programmes designed to accredit up to 60 hours of activity and skills development across a range of topics and curriculum areas. ASDAN Courses are certificated, which enable students to add to their qualifications and course portfolio to support students to prepare for working life and/or higher education.

In addition, British values are central to life at SupaJam for our young people. By breaking British Values out of the classroom and into debates and student podcasts across all our bases allows us to engage our students in a compelling and inclusive way and effectively reinforce the positives of these values.

Rock School (RSL) is a leader in accredited music qualifications for Level 1 to Level 3 focusing on the music industry.

SupaJam offers courses for aspiring producers, performers, songwriters, and entrepreneurs, creating an environment rich in music and creative production. Our "Creative Industries Qualification" emphasises practical performance, production, and event management, while also fostering business knowledge and entrepreneurship.

By teaching students about key roles within the creative industries and their interactions, SupaJam opens new doors for career opportunities in this dynamic field.

WHAT WE OFFER

One of our primary focuses at SupaJam is progressing students' skills in Maths and English.

We aim to deliver lessons that are fun, engaging and built around students' interests, incorporating as many 'out of classroom' experiences as possible.

We teach in small groups of similar ability learners, allowing students to develop at their own pace. Lessons tend to be informal but appropriately challenging for each learner to achieve their full potential.

SupaJam teaches English qualifications from Entry Level 3 to GCSE, and Maths qualifications from Entry Level 2 to GCSE.





ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Our commitment to improving literacy skills is reflected in our reading intervention scheme, 'Yes We Can Read'. This programme has a proven track record of enhancing learners' reading skills and phonic reading abilities. Delivered by our skilled practitioners, these weekly sessions, varying between 15 to 30 minutes, are tailored to the learners eligible for the programme.

We are proud to announce that our Swanley campus is now an approved examinations centre, and we are currently in the process of seeking approval for our Brighton campus to also become an examinations centre. Until then, any learner sitting GCSE examinations will do so at our Swanley base. At SupaJam, we are deeply committed to your academic success and are constantly seeking ways to enrich your learning experience. PRACTICAL MUSICIANSHIP

Students have dedicated time to work in the rehearsal rooms and venue space to develop original songs, collaborative performances and band projects; working towards future performance opportunities.




Swan Studios operates across all SupaJam bases offering students time with an in-house producer and engineer in a professional recording studio complex. Students have the opportunity to complete internal work experience, personal projects and RSL modules whilst developing skills in recording, songwriting and production, engineering, mixing and mastering. Students can also book sessions outside of college to make the most of the facilities.



Our flagship Swan Studios provision in Swanley features a large control room showcasing a new Audient 4816 mixing console, with 16 world class preamps. The studio complex also includes two live rooms, one housing a baby grand piano and an isolated vocal booth. In addition we have a range of Fender and Yamaha guitars, a Mapex acoustic drum kit and Marshall and Orange backline amps.

Each base has their own Swan Studios branch kitted out with top of range Audient hardware, meaning that all students can make the most of the resources and the opportunities available.





The Machine Room offers exciting opportunities for our students to get involved in such as the 'Wake Up with SupaJam' Breakfast Radio Show and the Creative Industries Podcast where we invite local creatives and industry professionals to be interviewed about their careers and experiences. The Machine Room is also a valuable tool by giving our learners the chance to debate, listen to others, discuss social issues and British Values in a safe and inclusive environment.





PHOTOGRAPHY INTERNAL WORK EXPERIENCE

The latest provision within the Creative Industries & Events Department is our dedicated Photography & Videography studio based in our Brighton base, supported by Canon. Students can make the most of the space which is equipped with professional lighting and the latest EOS E3 Mirrorless cameras, and develop skills which can be utilised at internal/external events. Our photography work experience has also taken our students to music festivals, concerts and PR Photoshoots for TV.

THE MUSIC SHELF INTERNAL WORK EXPERIENCE

The Music Shelf is a YouTube platform for emerging and established artists to showcase their music, in a unique and intimate performance space in front of a live audience. The Music Shelf allows students to work closely with professional artists, taking on roles such as photography, sound and lighting production, and artist liaison.

LIVE PERFORMANCE / INTERNAL GIGS

Although SupaJam is not a music performance college, we have a variety of live performance opportunities that students can take part in.

Each base hosts either an internal or external gig to celebrate the end of each half-term where students and staff come together to perform and showcase their practical musicianship. Students can also take on roles behind the scenes, helping to produce and deliver the events. The end of the academic year is then celebrated with a large-scale external music event that brings together students and staff from across the bases.



In 2023 we started working with one of the most exciting music festivals for new and emerging bands/artists, The Great Escape Festival.

Showcasing 500 emerging artists from all over the world in 30+ walkable venues across the city of Brighton and a pop-up festival site on Brighton Beach, The Great Escape Festival is an annual

Students have the opportunity to take part in external work experience focusing predominantly on Photography, Podcasting, and Journalism; capturing performances and all of the experiences of the festival, as well as interviewing the bands and artists.





Since 2018, SupaJam students have gained external work experience at the multi-award winning Black Deer Festival running their own stage; working in roles such as Artist Liaison, Photography and Journalism, Live Sound Engineering, Radio/Podcast Production and Live Performance. This unique work experience opportunity allows our students to take their learning outside of the classroom and into the real world, highlighting potential industry pathways students may want to explore beyond SupaJam.

Students support in many aspects of the festival before the event, from curating the line up, to designing merchandise and promotional material, to engaging in workshops from industry professionals and musicians. Skills and roles in the industry are explored and demonstrated across the festival weekend.


CAREERS SUPPORT AND WORK EXPERIENCE

We deliver 1:1 careers support to provide students with the opportunity to explore options and pathways. Our key aim is to encourage our students to creatively explore future options and become curious about the world of work, with regular encouragement, support, positivity and opportunities for new experiences. We support our students in developing key skills needed for college and beyond including resilience, independence, social communication skills, innovation, leadership and team building.

We are always happy for parents to reach out for advice relating to career and pathway options and keep an eye out for your termly parents newsletter for up to date news and information to support each student with careers and progression.





CELEBRATING DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

At SupaJam we recognise the importance of learning about different cultures, experiences, and celebrating everyone's individuality. We ensure that equality, diversity and inclusion is celebrated and embedded throughout SupaJam, including national holidays, events and important dates.


We are so excited to be opening up in Wandsworth. This will be our fourth SupaJam college and we will confirm it will have the following from launch:-

thriving college close to the city center.


